In the past, health services were delivered to achieve certain government policy, for example, reduction of fertility. But a wider vision promoted by the civil society overturned the view of health to one that incorporates the empowerment of women and human rights. In light of these new paradigm this course will examine key concerns in Mexico and the Latin America region: unintended pregnancies, combined presence of very low and high fertility, modern contraceptive use but inefficient use, unmet need for contraception, induced clandestine abortion, HIV/STIs, among others.
