



The International Climate Change Policy: Disagreements between Rich and Poor Countries and the Future of the Planetary Climate. Brazil, Mexico and US experiences.

The course will analyze the power factors that decide the policy positions of the different countries of the international community on climate change, as well as the decisions taken at the various climatic summits from 2007 to 2019, including the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement for the Climate.

It is of special interest to reflect on the way in which the future of the planetary climate depends on the perspectives, economic interests, political positions and commitments, often contrasted, adopted by rich countries and poor countries in climate agreements, as well as by the influence of the different economic blocs that dispute the world market and the resources of nature at the planetary level.

A fundamental aspect will be to follow up on the positions and commitments assumed by rich countries and by poor countries, exposing the reasons, arguments and power factors that explain them.

The final purpose of the course is to provide students with a vision of realism and political and economic pragmatism with which international climate negotiations take place and the way in which the fate of the planetary climate depends on those pragmatic games of economic power and political between countries and economic blocs.
